- Highways had been requested (and had agreed) to fill the grit bins but they were not supplying 25kg bags of grit free of charge, as they had done in previous years. Councillors asked the Clerk to investigate which villagers were previously supplied with bags of salt and to ascertain if there were unused bags available. The Clerk was also asked to research prices of salt from builders' merchants and bring to the December meeting.
